Yes, but at the same time,

I spent ten days strolling the sun in Ireland.

From the day eight,

it really started to get boring.

And every hotel where we checked in,

every restaurant, every pub,

they almost never participated.

It was like, what the fuck?

I couldn't do this.

We literally had to go on the whole trip for two hours.

And you thought, oh my God, I'm happy that this wasn't the whole trip.

That's the first thing we were doing in the car.

And that was the first time that Lucas and I said to each other,

if this was the whole trip,

we would have had a big problem.

Because the thing is,
it's like, go big or go home on an airfield.

at six o'clock in the evening.

And you think,

I'm going to a comedy show tonight.

You put your seatbelt on.

And then you're like, no.

No, no, no.

I'm going to bed for an hour.

Just go to bed.

And it's also a combination of the jet lag.

We were really,

I think I woke up at half past six.

So I was just not in the state
to stay awake late.

But we really,

we also had a really beautiful weather.

We had so much luck with it.

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We started at 17 degrees.
The day we left.
So five days later, 30 degrees.
Amazing.
That's really.
And then we came back here.
And then everyone was like,
oh, everyone has bad luck here.
Yes, I had that problem too.
I came home and you really started
in the rain.
You sat down and walked away.
No, not yet.
No, no.
But I have to say,
people had something like,
yes, and then those live shows,
yes, you're really going to get into a black hole.
No, I,
I miss it.
Because I think it's great.
But I still have something like,
oh, I have time to do other things.
I think, yes,
I just want to put it in perspective
that since December,
every evening,
every weekend,
has gone there.
And now I have something like,
I can go back to sports.
Just on a continuous day,
evening,
that I think, oh,
just a little bit of fitness.
I had it yesterday.
I had it yesterday.
It was also extended weekend.
And then the broadcast was broadcasted.
And I was like,
and now,
and wait,
I,
I,

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it,
it,

it was really like,
it's up.
I can't,
there's nothing else to do.

I can watch TV.

Lieslott, yes.

I'm so embarrassed.

Because I'm Liesbeth first.

But much more pronounced Thomas.

I was really like, Lieslott could do it, but I think...

We also started with Lieslott, Thomas and the Toes,

which are still in there.

Yes, but I'll tell you all about that later.

Okay, yes.

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So when Thomas was out, I found it very difficult.
And my biggest problem was that I had already written off Ruben.
So I hoped that he wouldn't be in the final.
At least I knew for sure that he wouldn't.
I don't know, Ruben has never been suspicious of me.
Me neither.
Annik and I said to each episode, you're going to ruin Ruben.
It took a long time.
Yes, he did it very well.
Yes, yes, yes.
But also because he wasn't suspicious at all.
No.
And because he was speaking to us,
that he wouldn't be in the final.
But for us, it was a possibility that he wasn't the Mole.
Yes, that was for sure for me.
And now...
Yes, so I say Lies.
Why?
Because...
Comfort is down for me because of that red screen.
And I would really like to find it more
if the program makers would have played it that way.
I really know what I'm talking about with that red screen.
Yes, yes, yes.
But why do you think...
Why would the program makers have given her red screens
for confusion?
Yes, that would be an option, I think,
if I read it online.
And the players also assume that
the people who participate still have that thought.
Is the red screen of comfort real?
Or was it part of the Mole that the makers put in it?
Now, the thing is,
but maybe I misunderstood that,
but for me, the Mole could also have got the red screen.
Because you can also fill the Mole's test every week.
And the Mole could have filled the worst test perfectly.
Yes, but that's pure nonsense, because you know...
I doubted it for a long time,
really until two hours back,
which I was going to say now.
Okay.

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But I decided that Comfort is for me the Mole.

Oh!

I'll say it like that.

But I'm sure...

No, I can't say it.

But what I'm almost sure of
is that the Mole is not the Mole.

Why not?

Because in the beginning,
when I saw him as a person
and on TV I saw a big difference,
I now see in the last four episodes,
really the Mole as I know him.

And Tos is clearly going for the game.

Not necessarily for the money,
but for every experience.

I think, my theory is,
that Tos already knows who the Mole is.
I think that Tos has seen something,
noticed something,
and quite quickly,
very risky,
but he's already gone to one person.

And because of that,
100%, I think he already knows who the Mole is,
but I also think

that Ruben,
and in my case Lancelot,
also knows.

And I think,
that they went for that red screen,
because maybe too many people already knew,
that Comfort was the Mole.

And they wanted
everyone to still doubt.

So my idea is that
I think that's the fall of the makers.

That's what I'm trying to say.

Do you understand?

That's a possible explanation.

I think,
for example,
with the same reasoning as I do,
that Tos already knows who the Mole is,

but he thinks that Lancelot is.
And my mum is even 100% convinced,
that Tos has seen that Lancelot's egg
has broken.
Yes, but I'm also not sure about that.
With the egg,
that's something that's engraved in my brain,
that Lancelot's egg
has been lost at some point.
But anyway, I also think,
okay, but that can also be
a candidate's action,
to raise confusion.
But I think that
Lancelot,
I'm not someone who keeps up with
how much money people bring in.
This is purely emotional.
Yes, even though it remains
on the background.
But then,
I think that the idea of that
with that class,
for example,
has done very well here,
just not good enough.
But the thing is, there are three very smart people
in the final,
and that's clear.
And they play all two,
yes, all two against the Mole,
but all three play the game,
all a few episodes,
on a really double level.
That's clear.
They make conscious mistakes,
there are those conscious hands.
I think that.
But I'm still going to look at it again,
because our mum was so convinced of that.
To those scenes,
we're in the car after the egg.
So the egg is broken.
Yes, yes, yes, yes.

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Before they arrive.

They already know that.

And Toast steps in Lancelot from behind in the car,
and Toast can't suppress his smile.

And Lancelot makes a remark

like, are you laughing now?

No, no, no, I didn't break the egg.

But maybe,

and that could be possible if Lancelot is the Mole,

that Toast has seen that Lancelot

has broken the egg,

and he thinks, okay, he's the Mole.

That's why I think he's the Mole.

Why?

Because I'm convinced that Toast knows who the Mole is.

He's convinced that he doesn't have a hair.

That assignment with the bus,

they had to choose between two colours.

Ruben had seen that.

And I think that Toast, Ruben didn't expect that.

But he said, I don't care,

we choose Ruben, not the coming year colour.

Now, with the photos,

he often works with her in a group,

now with the photos.

She calls at the end of the day,

stop doing that, you're not doing that.

Is it to manipulate the photos?

With the last photo,

to check if you're going to go back.

It was a sign of hair, that you're the pancake.

Yes, but the potfish,

with the potfish.

I know that.

But I also think, sorry, Ruben,

love the guy,

I laughed very well,

he did a few nice expressions,

really thick vibe.

But the fact that he made the guest,

I understand that people suspect Ruben.

For me, not.

But he really has a lot of stoutness,

because of the thought of being a guest.

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I would be Ruben if I do that.
Oh, sorry.
Oh, really?
Yes, I have to hit a button.
I'm going to do it.
I say,
Comey is the mole and Tosbind.
Ah, the winner.
But then you say,
Comey is the winner.
Okay, here we go.
Feeling,
really pure anger.
Yes.
I have to say,
it's the most difficult year for me so far.
I've never been good, except with Leonard.
With Leonard, we were good.
We were good, but last year,
I can't remember anymore.
Yes, then we had the false mole.
Yes, the switch.
So I can,
I always admire Wilder Gok.
Yes.
Yes.
And that has nothing to do with,
I think you're cool,
or I don't think you're cool.
No, no, no.
That's really,
I see one thing,
sneaky,
and then I think,
Yes.
Everyone does it.
And then someone else does something sneaky.
No, but that was a pro.
That's a fake mole action.
Yes, that's true.
That's to say a warning.
Yes, yes.
But again,
fun.

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I think it's already a pity that it's almost done.

Oh yes, but it went really fast.

We also said it,

Anniko and I,

last Sunday,

Oh, that's a shame.

Yes, just,

it's such a shame that it's already done.

Yes.

And then I said,

You have to continue this year.

I said that now too.

No, that is now also over there.

But yes, love it.

Yes, keep it coming.

Yes.

Will you write something next year?

Maybe for the LoLs.

Yes, I don't think we'll be able to do that tomorrow.

Hmm.

Mateo.

Matje Steve.

You had one job.

You had one job.

No, Esther,

but it really doesn't seem good.

Of course.

Yes, yes.

Yes.

So maybe we shouldn't do that.

A laugh and a train.

A laugh and a train.

Do you have any other TV tips?

Yes.

Did you look at something else?

Oh well, I was in,

yes, yes, in New York.

And you know,

when you're on vacation abroad,

other programs on Netflix,

and whatever.

And I see beef there.

And I think,

Oh, do I have to see it now?

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Because we can't see it at home.
Oh, bless your little heart.
Oh, so naive,
that I didn't see it before.
Just look at it.
But,
and I know,
I can't remember if I've already mentioned this,
or not.
But Ellie Wong did that with me,
and Ellie Wong is also a stand-up comedian.
And on Netflix,
there are three specials from her.
Look,
because I haven't laughed like that in a long time.
Like doing.
With a stand-up comedian.
Actually.
Yes.
I'm often someone,
I've talked to you about it.
Yes.
When I came to see it,
I was like,
Oh, it's like that.
But never really loud.
Hilarity,
Boulderlag,
Allie Wong-Wale.
Okay.
So,
three specials,
do what you want with it.
All right.
And beef.
Good.
I have a podcast tip.
Stolen hearts.
It's from Wondery,
and it's about a woman, Jill.
She's a police agent,
separated,
and she learns a new man.
I've heard about it, I think.

And they're in love.
They start a relationship.
It's getting serious.
They're going to live together.
Or they make plans to live together.
They're going to get pregnant.
And half-way through their pregnancy,
they try to reach them on an evening with the phone.
It doesn't work.
No reaction.
And then they get the phone from their sister
to say that her love is involved
in a pregnant woman.
Oh.
Voila.
Okay, good.
Yes.
Without a single signal in advance.
Okay.
And there are several episodes.
Yes, there are five or six episodes.
I have to listen to the last one now.
And I started listening to it
just through the catch,
I mean the pitch.
And I keep listening to it,
because it's really a techie,
not the right word,
but it's really up-beat
intro music.
And with wordsplayings.
But good.
You have to be for it.
And normally it bothers me,
but I don't know why.
I feel like...
I've been laughing for a long time.
It's very American.
No, because it's British.
Ah, it's British.
But it's an American vibe.
Oh, I see.
Because I think the intro music is
a good girl's number.

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Like the bad boys.
But really like a puppy.
Oh my God.
My eyes are rolling out of my pocket.
Yes.
Are you promoting it well?
I don't know.
I don't know.
I can't pitch it so well.
But it's just the story.
You know, it's so...
Very often when you tell a story,
and he wasn't who he looked like.
He looked like...
You can already see,
as a viewer or listener,
hundreds of red flags.
But I didn't see that either.
Interesting.
Okay.
I'm listening.
A stolen heart.
Anything else?
Yes, in your face,
something funny happened.
Okay.
No.
Now you're so scared.
No.
But it has to do with our sponsor,

Okay, on the side.

Business 2.

Well, that will be good for a live show.

We have something like this to look for.

So I have to put them all
on the map.

After the suggestions of the
listeners to look at.

Oh, yes.

No, that will also be good.

I thought, okay, I'm going to
choose another book.

I'm looking for a first thing.

Because I'm going to Ireland next week.

I'm coming up with a very big first
thing.

Again very good for the live shows.

I thought, stop.

I was really already half a day
busy with the search for a business
to bring.

And then in the end, I'm still on
an oldie wishlist of mine.

One that I've been wanting to do for a long time.

He will be unsurpassed,
he has already been suggested,
but I really didn't have the
time to look for someone
who has ever suggested it.

But there was also.

Anyway.

Anyway, but there was also
on my list.

Because it is in the period
that I really like.

We are going to bring the case today
of the sister's dad.

Voila.

It is 1901.

Turn of the century.

Anything else?

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No, that was.
Can someone make a sound here?
Party like is 1901.
And we are in the French village.
Le Mans.
And there live a certain Clemence
Déré
and farmer Gustave Pappin.
And those two are on a date.
But the relationship is difficult.
From the beginning actually.
Because there are reasons that
our Clemence also has an affair
with her boss.
We do not know what she does.
But yes, there should be an affair.
Now,
despite the affair,
Clemence and Gustave say,
look, we are going to make the best of it.
We trust.
And four months after their wedding
Clemence falls in love with a daughter.
It is a miracle.
They make the best of it.
And Emilia is born.
Now, our Gustave.
Yes, we still have to
that the affair is still going on.
He goes looking for a new job in a different city.
And when he arrives,
that they will have to get married.
I say Clemence.
Oh my God, it's such a vibe.
It's even better to take away from life
than to leave Clemence.
So you know,
you get a little bit of an idea
what kind of woman that is.
A bit turbulent.
But despite that,
there are still two daughters
from the world.
In 1905 Clemence from Christine

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and in 1911 from Lea.

Yes.

But that's not going so well right now.

No.

Christine is actually
immediately given birth
to her aunts and uncles.

And she actually lives there until she is seven.

And also Lea is moved to her uncle.

And she stays with him until he dies.

Now,

then,

I mean,

the life of the Papai family
has not yet been accepted.

No.

But then it just gets even worse
at that moment.

Because Emilia, the first daughter,
when she is nine or ten years old,
is encouraged by her father,
by her father-in-law.

But instead of giving her father-in-law
the guilt,

Clemence puts the guilt
on her daughter, Emilia.

Because she has her father
as her name suggests.

So what does she do then?

She sends her daughter to a Catholic church
that is known as Codoncote
for the disciplines.

Now,

a year later, in 1913,

Clemence says goodbye
to Gustave

because of the so-called incest.

It's still the guilt
of her daughter.

But she doesn't think
that Gustave has admitted it.

So there is a separation,
but there is no legal matter.

Because she also doubts

whether Gustave is
Emilia's father.

I already doubted that in the first instance.

So our Gustave
starts to drink hard.

So it's not going well
with the family there.

In the end, Christine and Lea
are sent to their home
where they have to stay until they are 15
where they would have to work
from Clemence.

And I think that's a good example
of Clemence,
of no man and no children anymore.

She's living her best life.

Yes, then it costs
quite some children's lives.

But today
would that woman
probably have no children?

No, no, no.

I mean,
I have to say that it is
indeed, it is not
a woman's family
to say that.

And I think that for her
in her mind-set,
she has something like

I am better off
so that I can do
what I want to do.

Of course, she doubts
an affair with her boss.

She probably doesn't want to get married.

But if she says
this is her life,
she is married.

So I have to marry a man here
and I do my best.

And unfortunately,
there are three children
for her.

Yes, yes, yes.

That's how she lives.

No, but then

I have already found
that Christine and Lea
are in one house,
but that Emilia is somewhere else.

So that she doesn't
have to be split.

Yes, I can.

What I have found
about Emilia
is that in 1918
a monastery
was built
and really
all gangs
broke up
with her family.

Yes.

And she just
sat there in the monastery
the rest of her life.

When I think about it,
you have sent us
hundreds of thousands of times,
so I'm not going to type anything,
but the podcast
about the disappearance
of Sister Gabriel,
and that's now the second time
I'm reading it,
and that's something
that I totally didn't know,
is that
girls who were abused
or were afraid
to be abused
or were abused
in an environment
that she fled to the monastery.

Yes.

So the monastery sisters
were also left to the word

in the podcast
of Sister Gabriel,
and they are convinced
that

why have you never been to the monastery?

That was a woman
who was going to the monastery
and who later left.

So yes,
the bond
on the brotherhood
of my parents
who couldn't
have his pot at home
and I went to the monastery
to prevent anger.

And now again,
that's really
a kind of curse
was for
abused women.

Okay, all good
that there was then.

Yes.

Jesus,
I didn't know that.

Yes,
because they were sure
that there was a relationship
with God or with Jesus,
that there was no physical contact.

So just
a bunch of traumatized girls
that would have been fun too.

Anyway.

Anyway.

I see that
at the beginning
you are also calling
to be a nun.

Yes.

But they are not allowed
by Clemens.

They are not allowed

to follow there
because
you are going to give me money.

At the time,
you were 15 years old,
you profited enough
from life.

It's time to go to work.

Where have you been?

Yes.

And Christine
starts as the first
to work with various families
as a household,
help
and from which they come
at the end of the year

with the family
Lancelang
in Le Mans.

And not for later
close her sister.

Leah, the youngest sister,
also there
so they are
at the funeral
at the family.

Let's see
who the family is.

Just do it.

At the head
of the family
we have René Lancelang.

deserves it.

Yes.

I have his house,
I have a photo

of the street,
the old street
and now
it's beautiful,

He has a wife,
Leonie,
and she has one daughter,
the 27-year-old
Genevieve.
I still thought
they had two daughters,
but that
the oldest
was
Albut.
Albut.
Well,
she didn't do it yet.
I only had Genevieve,
but also for Genevieve
hardly,
because she also lost.
So
she was actually
also at the point
to
leave the house.
I don't know
how people know that.
I've written a little bit
about how it
suddenly
sounds like household music
in those times.
It sounds like music

for me.
So
Lea
and
Christine
live in
both families.
An old man's house
in my house
also,
it's a normal studio.
Those are
the rooms.
So those are the rooms

eat there.
It's really simple
in that room
that they
can push themselves back.
And then
in the
living room
they get
a monthly fee
and they
have
a two-tall
hour-per-day
free.
And that
usually
just after lunch.
So
they have
a meal

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to go
to the market
to have
lunch,
to clean up
then
you have
a few hours
free and then
you have to
start the dinner
and other
household
tasks
like
cleaning,
cleaning,
cleaning.
Because
I had
read
with her
that
she
really
only
half a day
What
do we know
about
her time
when
the family in Lanselijn
was a
pretty strict family
but
it was
fair.
Leonie
the mother
said
she
had
to

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check
if
the
plants
were
really
stuffed.

If I
do this
in my house

I think
I have
hair
in my
house.

I have
my plant
in my house.
I don't have
plants.
Not your
trouble then.

So
the family
treated her
well
and other
families
were
pretty
strict
on
Leah and
Christine.

They
actually
had
the
reputation
of being
quiet
and
no drama
with boyfriends

or girlfriends
or
walking away.

Christine

was

cocky

and

Leah

was

the

chamber

girl

but

they

were

super

content

about

the

girls

when

it was

a

Friday

and then

I found

a kind of

contrast.

They

treated her

well

but

it was a

very

atypical

relationship

with Christine

and Leah.

The

two girls

never

talked

to her

in

Christine said,

And then they are found naked.

Yes, actually.

Now, the next day,

after the victims are found,

Christine and Lea

have put down their acquaintances.

It's in all of France.

And France is in shock.

They really have something like

how can this happen in Le Mans?

The two sisters,

they worked together for seven years

for the family.

Christine was 21,

Lea was 15

at the time of the accident,

when I was well.

And they also had a reputation

of being good workers.

They were calm.

They often got back together.

They also didn't really have
friends or something like that.

They were really on their own.

And as I said earlier,
they were honest, hard workers
who worked there for a long time.

They had a white cloth.
But still, out of nowhere,
the two quiet maidens
have turned against their base.

Yes.

And for everyone,
the maidens,
the workers,
the maidens,
come in there as a shock,

as my household help,
they turn against me in the morning.

She tries,
at some point,
to rip her own eyes out of her pockets.
The experience does have to do with it.

Yes, she knows how it should be,
in any case.

But they can stop her,

and she is actually getting
stuck in a prison at that moment.

It will take eight months
to start the process.

I am very curious
whether she will be in prison for eight months.
Yes, she will be in prison.

She will keep changing her story at that moment.
And that she will be in prison.

Because until then,
they said together,
that they had done it together.
But Christine says from that moment
that she was responsible only
for the murder.

That Lea had nothing to do with it.

But the judges,
the people who lead the investigation,
won't listen to her.

And Lea also says,
yes, but I was happy.

Yes, yes.

Yes.

Lea, please.

Yes.

Take it.

Take it.
Yes, but indeed,
Christine tries to take back
the worrying role of her sister
by saying,

I have done it all.

Just before the two of them
go to the court,
they are examined by psychologists
to see if there are any

during the process,
they come back to the
mental history
of the family.

Because there were
mental problems in the family.

There was an uncle
who was out of his life,
there was a nephew in the institution,
a father with alcohol,
abuse.

Yes.

So, yes.

Yes, that's it.

I also understand it,
because, hey,
especially the defense
who focused on that very much.

To talk about it,
but the two of them were
temporarily sick.

And this is
in the genes.

But now they are OK.

What do you have to do
if you are going to do that?

They are known.

The bodyguards are there.

Yes, you have to find something
to...

Yes, but in the end,
they actually remain
in that process
for a very long time.

Weeks and weeks
about what can be
in their hands.

In the end,
they come to a conclusion.

They can decide
beforehand,

really talk of,

there was also a moment
when Leah
apparently
forgot to scratch

a hundred years ago,
that there are really
still people living in it.
It sounds fantastic to me,
but on the other hand,
it's just fucking weird
that there are

with a super

simply via paper,

No rights,
nothing.
...that you
can't talk about the man's house.
For seven years,
when someone
could never say a word to you.
