So I told you yesterday, the Israeli army announced this Tuesday that its military operation was entered into its third phase which consists of a massive invasion of Gaza.

So violent confrontations on the ground took place this Tuesday in Gaza.

Notably in the tunnels under Gaza, used by Hamas.

Tunnels that Israel nicknamed the Gaza metro.

But then what exactly does this tunnel look like?

So, Yosved Lipsitz, one of the free Israeli hostages a few days ago by Hamas,

compared this underground network to a real spider web and mentioned a lot, a lot of tunnels.

Concretely, under the Gaza strip, which is a territory of nearly 360 km2,

it hides nearly 500 km from the gallery, according to Hamas.

These tunnels are therefore not built in a linear way.

They are really zigzagged and the whole on several levels.

Some of these galleries would even be dug up to 40 meters underground.

In this tunnel, of course, sometimes it's all black, sometimes they are very narrow.

It is therefore very difficult to spot them, especially if you don't know them well.

According to Daphne Richemont, who is a specialist in urban conflicts and who is

interviewed by RFI, in a link that I put in the description.

Some passages are probably guite wide enough to let go of a bike or a truck,

which shows the differences according to the tunnels.

Besides, after them, these tunnels are a real military base.

So it's not just tunnels.

We find them more widely, rooms, rooms, ports, electricity.

In other words, what to live underground for Hamas today.

So what is this tunnel and why were they set up?

Well, initially, these first tunnels were created in the 80s,

so before the creation of Hamas, and so that at the time,

Palestine faced the contraband with Egypt,

for example, by importing cigarettes, clothes or food.

Indeed, at that time, and since the end of the Six Days War in 1967,

well, it was Israel who controlled the Gaza Strip.

And so it's a way, well, for some groups,

to get even to import some elements directly underground.

So quickly, this tunnel network is recovered by Hamas,

which was founded in 1987.

And in 2005, a year after Hamas' victory to the Palestinian elections,

Israel removed these troops from the Gaza Strip following the Second Intifada.

At that time, after the withdrawal of Israeli troops,

this tunnel network will be developed and will be developed more precisely by Hamas.

So today, these tunnels are particularly strategic for Hamas,

especially for the passage of man, of material,

of weapons too, obviously, via Egypt,

but also to build stocks and command centers.

Besides, this tunnel would have also been used at the attack of this October,

according to the first information.

And we also know that some of the prisoners-of-war civilians

were then hidden directly in these tunnels.

So, of course, for the Israeli army, it is an important challenge.

Indeed, Hamas has the advantage over Israel in these underground tunnels,

since it is in defense situations.

And you may remember it because we have already talked about it, for example,

in the case of the war in Ukraine.

The defense position is generally more favorable to an attacking position.

Indeed, it is easier to prepare the ground.

And this is even more the case here with this tunnel network,

since Hamas necessarily knows this network at the end of his fingers.

While Israel obviously knows it much less.

So, to better know it all the same, it is a tunnel.

Israel tries to count on surveillance technologies,

technologies that have been developed a lot in recent years,

especially by satellites.

But however, it remains very difficult today,

and the information is necessarily limited.

One of the difficulties, in particular, is that certain entrances are sometimes hidden

in buildings or civil sites, according to certain sources.

And for example, in December last,

the United Nations Organization discovered a Hamas tunnel

dug under one of its schools.

More broadly, Israel accuses Hamas of voluntarily placing civilians

near military targets.

Hamas, on its side, defends and accuses Israel

of seeking a pretext for these bombings.

So, even if the Israeli army has asked for the evacuation of the north of the Gaza Strip,

well, civilians are still on the spot and strikes in the tunnels

to lead to the death of many Palestinian civilians.

The question of the fate of these close to 230 Israeli hostages and foreigners

is also in suspense.

In parallel, in any case, the Israeli bombing continues,

making thousands of deaths and thus plunging the Palestinian population into an extremely critical humanitarian situation.

We will continue to follow the evolution of the situation in the coming days.

The second act of anti-semitic attacks was discovered

these last days in the 14th arrondissement of Paris and in several cities of Saint-Saint-Denis, especially Saint-Denis, Saint-Denis and Oberville.

It is the star of David traced to the pouches, which is therefore the symbol of Judaism,

which was also used by the Nazis during the Second World War.

Plains were deposited and inquiries are in progress.

In the Paris region, at least three Jewish schools received threats
